

## Matt Owen and Andrew Reed off to a flying start

### Flying Fifteen Australian Championships at Mornington YC

A fleet of 35 Flying Fifteens have travelled to Mornington Yacht Club on Port Philip Bay in Victoria for the 2018 Flying Fifteen Australian Championship held from January 1st - 6th. Some competitors have made a long journey from Queensland, Western Australia and even one entry from Hong Kong.



The invitational race, also used as a practice race on New Year's Eve had a slow start. The race committee waited for some time for the breeze to fill but to no avail, eventually hoisting AP over H and the fleet returned home. In a cruel twist, as the fleet were almost back inside the harbour a nice breeze appeared from the SSW. Some

boats used this as an opportunity to test and tune.

Race day 1 delivered a light to moderate breeze of 8 - 10 knots from a SSW direction. Gradually as the afternoon progressed the pressure increased to around 17 knots with a bit of a lumpy sea.

Greg Tonnison and Graham Lillingston from South of Perth YC in WA, made an excellent start to their regatta winning the first race of the day but slumped to 14th in the second race as the pressure built.

“We got into second spot on the fourth beat and into the lead on the middle leg of the triangle. We made good gains downwind but Matt Owen was always on our heels. We made a few mistakes in the second race of the day, we didn't expect the wind to come in as strong as it did so we got our settings all wrong and were a bit slow.” summed up Greg

One of the regatta favourites, Matt Owen and Andrew Reed from Canberra YC, took out second and Sue Thompson and Cameron Taylor from Davey's Bay YC, third.

The pressure built up a bit for race 2 of the day as did a slightly confused lumpy sea. Matt Owen and Andrew Reed were in charge of this one from the start.

Matt's summary of his race win;



“Really interesting, great courses, some confused seas but great fun. Andrew Reed, ‘Mr Tactics’ and ‘Mr Compass’ got us round the course today, he did a great job, I just had to steer this new boat where he tells me to go.”

The local Flying Flamingo boys from Davey's Bay YC, Lewis Davies and John Radnell, scored an excellent second place and Sue Thompson and Cameron Taylor again crossing third.

Cameron summed up his solid day on the water;

“There was building pressure in both races, both with good true courses. It was difficult because there were some heavy waves on port tack but they were smoother on starboard. Some good downwind runs in 15 knots though.”

Two more races on day 2 with similar wind speeds of 15 knots dropping for a while after the start of the first race of the day and gradually building later in the afternoon.

Matt Owen and Andrew Reed from Canberra were on form all day winning the first race of the day to receive the impressive Uffa Fox Trophy, and following it up with a second in race 4 of the regatta.

Matts summary: "We had around 15 knots at the start, it dropped a bit and kicked in again on the third leg. It was a case of changing gears all day. Pressure built during the race, we got a pretty good start and good boat speed, it was really fun sailing in good breeze. The breeze kept coming and going so it kept up on our toes. We had a few breakages onboard in the second race but Ashley and Adam had a blinder of a start and we couldn't catch them so we just had to consolidate to hold on to second."

Race 3 was won by John Wilson and Matthew Summers from South of Perth YC, with Matt and Andrew in second and David Swan and Matt Elliot all the way from Esperance YC in WA on the podium in third.

David Swann was happy with his day;

"In race 3 we had a good start and excellent boat speed. We started at the pin, worked the left of the course to round the top mark around 6th. On the final work we chewed up 3 more boats to finish 3rd on the line so we were very pleased with that."

"In the second race of the day we were a bit sloppy, lacked a bit of boat speed and got caught up to round about 15th in the pack on the first lap, but clawed our way up to 10th by the finish."

Queenslanders, Ashley Smith and Adam Kingston from Sandgate SC won race 4 of the regatta by a big margin from start to finish.

Ashley explains;

"It was windier before the start of the earlier race so we put in a lot of mast rake, but the wind eased to 10 - 12 knots after the start so we had to adjust it again. We started at the pin, had good height and speed and got good speed off the line. We had a nice lead at the first mark, 10 boat lengths or more, got the kite up and cleared out. On the second work we rounded about 15 boat lengths clear. Matt couldn't split away so we didn't really need to cover Matt & Reedy.

In the Silver division for older Flying Fifteen's, Karen and Russell Dawes from South of Perth YC are the early leaders.

Racing continues tomorrow with two more races.

## Matt Owen & Andrew Reed extend their lead

### Flying Fifteen Australian Championship at Mornington YC

The Canberra YC team of Matt Owen and Andrew Reed have moved into a commanding position with two bullets on race day 3 of the Flying Fifteen Australian Championship held at Mornington YC on Port Philip Bay.

Two more races held in perfect Flying Fifteen conditions, the first race of the day, race 5 of the championship, was started in 12 - 15 knots, building to 15 - 17 knots for race 6. A longer course using shorter legs but a triangle, sausage, triangle and work to the finish configuration, provided lots of three sail reaches and exciting downwind sailing.



Andrew Reed, crew on board the winning boat, Cool Change, describes their winning performances:

*"In race 5 we started right down at the pin end, led round the top mark and on the triangle, the boats in front extend, so a couple of good waves and that was it. Some good gybes and fantastic surfing on the runs".*

*"We started mid line in race 6 and worked mid left, the boat felt really good. A couple of well timed waves on the first reach and we got away again. We had good*

*boat speed and solid boat handling. It's a good atmosphere out there, everyone's in a good space."*

John Wilson and Matthew Summers from South of Perth YC are starting to string some consistent results together finishing second and fourth, to move into second place overall but 11 points shy of the leaders.



Sue Thompson and Cameron Taylor from local club, Davey's Bay YC also had a stellar day moving into third overall with a 6th and 3rd today.

*"In race 5 we changed places quite a bit at the front end of the fleet. We lost a few places downwind but gained them back upwind."*

*"In the second race we gained a lot of places at the bottom gate after the run, when we chose the opposite gate to the lead pack and came out on really good numbers. We stuck with it to pass several boats to move into 3rd. Two boats caught us on the triangle but on the final working leg we were exhausted but found another gear to hold on for 3rd."*



Sue's son John Radnell, part of the colourful 'Flying Flamingo' crew, traded places with his mother in both of today's races. Skipper Lewis Davies and John fill in some of the details of their eventful day.

*"Race 5 was eventful, we started second row and tacked for clear air, rounded around 10th, but I went for a bit of a swim, missing the toe straps! But we climbed back to 7th at the finish."*

*"Race 6 was glamour, we started at the boat end and took the right side and rounded second and stayed there throughout the race. Lots of good surfing today it was really fun racing."*

The local lads move up to 5th overall, two points behind David Swan and Matt Elliot from Esperance Bay YC in WA, who had a sound day with two 5th places.

Two more races are scheduled on the penultimate day of racing to try and catch the flying Canberra team.

## Light airs cause some surprises

### Flying Fifteen Australian Championship at Mornington YC

A light day on Port Philip Bay on the penultimate day of racing at the Flying Fifteen Australian Championships, shuffled up the pack a bit with some of the leaders suffering double digit scores. However Matt Owen and Andrew Reed (Canberra YC) have one hand on the trophy moving 16 points clear of the competition with a bad forecast for the final day of racing.

The windward/leeward courses were used to both of today's races and it was a tactical day for Craig and Ian Rainey from Gippsland Lakes YC to shine. The Rainey's sailed well in the light airs to win race 7 and take 4th in race 8 to move up the leaderboard into 3rd on the podium.

The Rainey's summed up their performance: *"The conditions suited our light weights, we have been coached by Ricky Riggs in the UK and he is the man who has helped us in this stuff. We started just down from the boat with*

*clear air, and worked up to the first mark to lead the race and managed to lead everybody around the course."*



The other surprise package was newcomers Stephen Fries and Richard Machin from Sandringham YC, who were observed to be sailing with quite a different technique in the light airs with crew weight well forward and slightly heeled to leeward. It clearly worked as they also scored 4th and won the last race of the day.

Overnight runaway leaders Matt Owen and Andrew Reed had a day to forget by their high standards, using up both their discards (8,12). Second placed overall,



John Wilson and Matthew Summers suffered a similar experience scoring (6,12). Sue Thompson and Cameron Taylor who were going great guns suffered their worst day using both discards (11,24), allowing the Rainey's to move up to 3rd overall.

Strong northerlies are forecast for the final day of racing so we have to wait and see if anyone can catch the flying Canberra boys.

## Matt Owen & Andrew Reed win Flying Fifteen Australian title

### Flying Fifteen Australian Championship at Mornington YC

With adverse weather conditions on the final day of racing at the Flying Fifteen Australian Championships held out of Mornington YC on Port Philip Bay, the penultimate days results stand handing the title to Matt Owen and Andrew Reed from Canberra YC.



Matt Owen has now held the famous Coweslip Trophy for a fifth time as skipper and once as crew. He and crew Andrew Reed sailed a superb series with only wins or seconds, with the only blip being the light day which provided their two discards.

*"We are absolutely over the moon, it has been a tough series for us, we have had a new boat beautifully donated to us by David Williamson. Andrew & I had to spend time working out how to get the boat going, It was going super fast in the breeze but we couldn't get it going in the light stuff which wasn't too pretty, but we luckily had a good early part of the series which gave us a good buffer before big Craig came charging in at the end".*



Second overall goes to John Wilson and Matthew Summers from South of Perth YC in Western Australia. John summarises his week.

*"Its been excellent, terrific sailing venue, we are pleased, we got 3rd last year, 2nd this year so 1st next year? Weather was spot on, race management was excellent, overall an excellent regatta."*



Craig & Ian Rainey from Gippsland Lakes YC came on strong in the light airs to claim third place on the podium. "First off I really enjoyed the regatta, I love sailing at Mornington, Primarily I think the reason we have done good here is our ability to have good boat speed in light winds and heavy winds. Previously the heavy winds have been an issue but we have worked on that and

we have been quite consistent all week.”



Sue Thompson and Cameron Taylor from Davey's Bay YC started the week really strongly only to drop off the pace on the last day of racing, however Sue was still thrilled with their progress to finish fourth overall. *“It is my best result at a F15 National championship. A good week, trying conditions but we managed to hang on by our fingernails. Only one bad day on the penultimate day in the super light breeze. Those two races were our two drops.”*

The young bucks of the fleet, Lewis Davies and John Radnell from Davey's Bay YC, sailing the Flying Flamingo won the 'Rising Stars Trophy'.

*“Its been a great week, its been mixed situations between heavy breeze and light breeze, we finished equal 8th, technically 9th overall and no wins but two-seconds, so its been a great regatta for us.”*



Overseas visitors, Oliver Merz and Nick Atkinson sailing 'Exbrats' from Royal Hong Kong YC enjoyed their regatta finishing a respectable 14th overall.

*“Its been a top regatta, we got all the races in, a lot of volunteers out there helping us, cracking conditions, a lot of camaraderie and good racing. We came 14th overall, better than we thought, a few top ten results, we learnt a lot but still plenty of areas to improve.”*
