# PUSTRPLIAII MPTIONRLS: Westward Ha! 

After trailing their boats 8000 km , three Western Australia FRs filled the first three places. It was sixteen years since the last W.A. victory. Next year Geoff Black and Gazelle will be defending on their own water, the Swan River, during the week before the Worlds.
The series, sailed on Lake MacQuarrie, NSW, attracted 54 entries. It seems to have been sailed in predominantly light winds, although there was quite a bit for the first race. Defending Champions, Ken Jenyns and Ray Reynolds, won by over a minute from the carly leader, Nils Blumann, and Peter McCauley's Innisfree; it seems there was some confusion in the finding of the wing mark in this race.
Race 2 was in lighter winds, and went comfortably to Dick Kernot from fellow west Australian, Richard Verko. Ken Jenyns made a late run through the fleet to third place. By now feoff Black had collected himself a couple of fourths, and he added a win to these in the third race, coming home ahead of Tony Wood. The early leader had been 20-year-old David Lowe, who had built his own boat; unfortunately he lost places through not covering, apart from which he sailed an excellent and most exciting race. Ken Jenyns was third again, and indeed yet again in Face 4: a $30^{\circ}$ shift was best anticipated by Messes Jenyns and Verko, with the latter moving away to win from Dick Kernot, with Ken apparently affected by a tide which had caused no-one any concern earlier.
Race 5 was a long duel between Geoff Back and Peter McAuley, with the honours eventually going to Geoff, together with the overall lead in the series. Bill Shan gave a great exhibition of sailing, moving through the fleet to third. He was second to Richard Verko in the fth Race, with John Smith 3rd. This left three boats in it: Gazelle (Geoff Black), Secret Flyer (Ken Jenyns) and Charisma (Richard Verso).
In the last race, Secret Flyer coulan't find the boatspeed to break away from the pack in light airs, which left Gazelle and Charisma to decide the title: they sailed a close race to the top mark, and then Charisma broke well away. At the finish she needed only two more points to take the title. The race was won by John Smith, from Dick Kernot (taking overall 3rd place) and Nils Blumann.

[^0]Many of the trophies to be won at the 1978 National Championships were made from the timbers of 'Gretel 11'.

Gretel 11 is internationally famous as the strongest challenger for the America's Cup in the last 43 years. Only one other yacht has won a race against the Americans since 1934. This was Gretel 1 which won one heat in 1961

Gretel 11 won two heats against Intrepid in 1970 under the hand of Jim Hardie. Gretel 11 had to eliminate 'France l' first for the right to challenge.

Gretel 11 is also well known for her $4: 3$ elimination series which she lost in 1977 to a highly competitive 'Sverige'. Although she was old for a contender she showed that she could provide a viable challenge against new and expensive yachts.

Before leaving for the United States in 1977 a major over-haul and refurbishing took place. Some of the timber removed was given by Halvorson and Gowland to the Lake Macquarie fleet for trophy making.

Each of the heat winners and best entry from each state and overseas will win trophies made from this timber. Where original paint or varnish remained on the timber, it has been left, even if marked, to retain the authenticity. In addition ALL entries will be presented with a small piece of the rib and planking from Gretel 11. A lot of trouble has been taken to cut a meaningful piece of timber. Almost every piece shows:-

1. The laminated rib section
2. The outside planking and paint
3. The dowell (tree nail) which holds the planking to the ribs.
4. The wedges within the dowell which spread the dowell at both ends.
5. The plug to cover the dowell.

Many people of course think that yachts are nailed or screwed together. This often is true, however, Gretel 11 was craftsman built and is fastened together with hundreds of these dowells which reduce the stress by distributing the load over a greater surface area.

We at Lake Macquarie hope and feel that these small pieces of history will have some intrinsic value to each entry for many years to come. In addition the name of the entry will as far as possible be inscribed on the momento.
