THE FF NATIONALS - OR HOW WE REALLY LEARNED TO LOVE LBG!

Looking back on the FF Nationals with the benefit of some weeks distance, I have to say that our feelings as we drove home from Melbourne have been basically confirmed. We had a great time. There was good fellowship, our hosts were impeccable, Port Phillip has not changed one jot from the last time, they have (definitely) not watered the beer even in these hard times, and I still think our boats are 'on the pace', even if it took some races before we worked out how to make our new G&R sails work.

Before leaving Canberra, the three of us that made the journey were aware there would be more than forty boats competing for the Cowslip Trophy. One did not have to be Einstein to work out that the competition would be fairly tough with numbers like that and this certainly proved to be the case.

So there were a few doubts as we drove to Frankston. Would the boats hold together in the Port Phillip chop? Would we be left behind by the proverbial country mile? Was Nigel's strict Guinness training regime enough to guarantee victory?

It was difficult to avoid something of a sinking feeling after arriving at Davey's Bay YC. All the class heavies were there – Alderson, Lillingston and Blumann from the West; Smith and Walker from Queensland; Thompson, Gale, Shand, Rainey and Meldrum from Victoria; and an overseas ring-in such as Cleaver from Scotland. Also, the very heavy Calvert-Jones was there, bringing Australian big boat fame with him. Without sounding defeatist, this left the best possible place for normal mortals as thirteenth! The message from very early on was that the racing would be very competitive and this is of course how it turned out.

Defeatism aside, the great thing about Nationals is that you very soon work out who your competition is. When you do this, the heavies (if you aren't racing against them) become something of a nuisance and definitely a problem if you should find yourself in the middle of a group of them on the starting line. By the time the last few races came up, we knew precisely who we were competing with, because we had effectively been racing against them for some time at that stage.

I have to say we were a little miffed by the weather. Those who hung on to Mark Rimington's every word when he visited Canberra might recall his comment that he thought Davey's Bay would be a quiet series. He turned out to be right. Aside from the Invitation Race and Heat 1, which would have been around 20 knots, and provided some thrilling sailing, the remainder of the series was in light to medium winds. In fact three (yes, three) races were abandoned for lack of wind and final results were based on a six race series, rather than the seven programmed. There was one memorable occasion when we started in a very light northerly. After 15 minutes of heavy racing we were glued to the start line, our forward speed being negated by the outgoing tide – at that stage the heavies were about 50 metres ahead, which looked like a huge distance to Nigel and I.
