# **AUSTRALIAN CHAMPIONSHIPS 1994/95**

The 33rd Australian Championships for the Flying Fifteen International were hosted by the Royal Queensland Yacht Squadron and sailed on the inner Olympic course, Waterloo Bay.

Sailed over 7 races with one race to drop, a smaller than expected but high class fleet participated comprising 4 boats from each of Western Australia and Canberra, 8 from Queensland, 9 from Victoria and 2 internationals making up 27 in total.

The series started with two invitation races on the new trapezoid Olympic course with wind increasing from the south east to 30 knots. Breakages and discretionary retirements were the order of the day.

Ashley Smith/Phil Will from Qld in Fathom struck the first blow in race 1 from Craig and Ian Rainey with James Flower/Steve Tyrrell third.

Races 2 & 3 were sailed the following day with James Thomson/David Sanders clear winners in race 2 from Graeme Lillingston/Edmond Repsevicius and the Raineys third.

Graeme Lillingston won race 3 by over 1 minute from Ashley Smith with Bill Shand/Stuart Wood a close third. An unfortunate incident at the start saw James Thomson complete the race with a split in the deck one metre long and a severely bent mast amazingly finishing in 6th place and later being awarded average points for this race.

The mid-week lay day saw James and David first trying to straighten the mast with the assistance of Bill Shand finally deciding to re-build an old spar for the following day. The deck repair was hastily completed by fellow Victorians. Race 4 saw a change in conditions with gusty 20 knot winds and a strong tidal influence causing sharp chop and big gains for those quick enough to pick the big lifts around the island. Adrian Jensen/Ross Hunter won from Graeme Lillingston and association president Nils Blumann third.

James Thomson made amends for race 3 with -a good win in race 5 from Graeme Lillingston and UK visitor Ian Cleaver/Mark Holmes.

Again in race 6 James Thomson closed the narrow gap as Graeme Lillingston remained consistent with a second and our visitor from the UK James Flower/Steve Tyrrell gaining third.

At this stage of the regatta the scenario was set for a close final points standing, with two fleets made up of the quick and not so quick, separated by a matter of 150 metres, of the lesser experienced and more distinguished in the second half of the fleet any opportunity or tactic was utilised in a field of oneupmanship to improve ones position, good fun.

Race 7 turned out to be Ashley Smiths from Graeme Lillingston and Dave Meldrum/Michael Brown scoring well.

#### **Flying Fifteen News**

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AUSTRALIAN CHAMPIONSHIPS : Three Canberra Flying 15s, *Rustler, Snabb Fisk, and The Boat Comes Ffirst,* made the long trip to Brisbane to compete in the 33rd Australian championship series on Waterloo Bay out of the Royal Queensland Yacht Squadron over the period 31 December to 7 January. The Squadron dates back to the 1880's and displays memorabilia to prove it, including a panel of photographs of every former Commodore and Yachtsman of the Year. Club facilities and service are excellent and the racing was conducted in a very professional manner - I guess that the presence of a full time, paid, Sailing Secretary helps in that respect.

The sailing program provided for an invitation race comprised of two back to back races, each of about one hour duration, over the trapezoid style course, followed by 7 heats, including 2 heats on each of 2 days over the old Olympic style course (with a windward leg of 1.2 nautical miles). Twenty six boats representing 4 States competed including 3 former Australian champions, with some 12 Australian titles between them!

The invitation race was sailed in winds in excess of 30 knots from the SE, resulting in half the fleet deciding that one of the two races was a sufficient warm up for the series, but the remaining races were sailed in 15 to 18 knot N to NE winds which provided for great sailing, especially on the reaching legs. There were four different heat winners but the ultimate winner, Graeme Lillingston from WA, won only one heat - but was second in five heats. James Thomson from Victoria finished second, with three heat wins, followed by Ashley Smith, from Queensland, with two wins. Generally, racing up at the front of the fleet was close and highly competitive. For instance, in heat 6, less than 1 minute separated the first four boats, after 2 hours of racing.

Racing was also competitive elsewhere in the fleet, and we each found our own group of competitors. *The Boat Comes Ffirst*, sailed by Peter Forster and Mick Roche, tended to be on its own between the front and the back group and finished in 15th place overall. Colin Brown and Nigel Grime, sailing *Snabb Fisk*, won the handicap event sailed in conjunction with the series and finished 19th overall in the championship. The big disappointment for us was that Peter and Phillip Russell were unable to compete further after the invitation race because of a sciatic nerve problem suffered by Phillip.

While in Brisbane, we sold the virtues of Canberra as a sailing venue for the next big Nationals, in January 1996, for which planning has already started, and as a popular and worthwhile tourist destination. We confidently expect a fleet of more than 40 Flying 15s to compete in the Canberra series - aspiring entrants from other classes in Canberra would be well advised to start their Flying 15 sailing this season if they want to be competitive in 12 months time! As a result of discussion in Brisbane, we will be looking at the feasibility of using the trapezoid style course on LBG and we are likely to provide for, say, 12 shorter races, rather than 7 long ones (in Brisbane, each heat took the fleet at least 2 hours to complete).
